




## LLIS.gov Mass Evacuation Resources

### MASS EVACUATION PAGE FEATURES

The LLIS.gov Mass Evacuation page is a one-stop resource for basic evacuation guidance, evacuation plans, and information related to evacuation transportation, reentry, urban area evacuations, evacuee sheltering, and hospital evacuations. The page offers evacuation planning guidance on topics such as:

- City/State-Assisted Evacuations;
- Evacuation Transportation and Traffic Control;
- Evacuation Reentry;
- Evacuation Behavior;
- Public Communications;
- Mass Sheltering; and
- Shelter-in-Place.
